



Topic: The Resurrection of Jesus

2. How does Paul articulate the importance of the resurrection in 1 Corinthians 15, and what does it teach us about the implications for our faith?

Reflect on the concept of the resurrection as central to the Christian hope and the transformative power it holds over death and sin.

3. In what ways does the resurrection of Jesus impact your personal faith, sense of hope, and daily life?
