



Topic: The Feast of Passover

Scriptures: Exodus 12:1-14, Deuteronomy 16:1-8, John 1:29 and 1 Corinthians 5:7-8

Questions:

- 1. What was the significance of the Passover lamb and the blood in Exodus 12, and how does this imagery connect to the New Testament understanding of Jesus as the Lamb of God?
- 2. In Deuteronomy 16, God commands the Israelites to celebrate Passover as a commemoration of their deliverance. What practices were established for this celebration, and why is it important for believers today to remember and celebrate God's past deliverance?
- 3. How does understanding the significance of Passover enhance your appreciation of the New Testament teachings about Jesus' sacrifice? What implications does this have for your personal faith and worship?
